My Sponsor passed away this year in June (with 44 years of Sobriety, RIP Charles Noland) and one of the first things after the Drunken Fog cleared he highly suggested that I get inside of the circle and triangle of AA and get involved in giving back what was so freely offered and given to me inside of the rooms of AA. This was a suggestion I followed without reservation and by the grace of God I have stayed sober ever since I walked into the doors of Alcoholics Anonymous for my very first time. So I give a lot to the words of "Don't Drink, Go To Meetings, Ask for Help, Read the Big Book, Get a Sponsor, and with an emphasis on "Get Involved!" as I have never seen an involved alcoholic drink!

In saying Thanks; I owe so much to an awesome Committee of District 12 who have given so much of their time to meet every 3rd Sunday of the Month and report on our Groups throughout our District from Champaign, Charleston, Farmer City, Mattoon, Rantoul, Oakland, Tilton, Tuscola, Urbana, Mahomet, Paxton, Bondville, Danville, Monticello, and Tolono who all came as GSR's, Officers or Committee Chairs with the *responsibility statement in their hearts* of keeping the doors open for the next person who is asking for help! We handle every meeting with all egos aside as we knew that we were there to serve not to lead. All our meetings started and ended within the hours of 2 to 3 pm and we did it without any arguments or leaving with resentments as we all understood our code of "Love and Tolerance". Personally, I did it as outlined in the Big Book of Alcoholics Anonymous (Doctor Bob's Nightmare pg 181) for four reasons;

1. Sense of duty.

2. It is a pleasure.

Because in so doing, I am paying my debt to the man who took time to pass it on to me.
Because every time I do it I take out a little more insurance for myself against a possible slip.

It must be used with tolerance, for I have restricted its application to no race, no creed and no denomination. Personal criticism you must expect; lack of appreciation will be common, ridicule will be your lot; your motives will be misjudged. You must be prepared for adversity, for what men call adversity is the ladder you must use to ascend the rungs toward spiritual perfection and remember, in the exercise of this power I shall not exact from you beyond your capabilities. You are not selected because of exceptional talents and be careful always, if success attends your efforts not to ascribe to personal superiority that to which you can lay claim only by virtue of my gift. If I had wanted learned men to accomplish this mission, the power would have been entrusted to the physician and scientist. If I had wanted eloquent men, there would have been many anxious for the assignment, for the talk is the easiest used of all talents with which I have endowed mankind. If I had wanted scholar men, the world is filled with better gualified men who would be available. You were selected because you have been the outcasts of the world and

your long experience as a drunkard has made or should make you humbly alert to the cries of the distress that come from the lonely hearts of Alcoholics everywhere! Keep ever in mind the admission you made on the day of your profession in A.A. - Namely that you are powerless and that it was only with willingness to turn your life and will unto my keeping that relief came to you!

May God bless each and every one of us and may our District stay strong under its new servants that we have trusted to continue as we were once trusted with!
