I FIND AA EVERYWHERE I TRAVEL

Several years ago, I viewed with great hesitation my first sober business trip as a member of AA. I was only six months sober at the time.

In preparation for my trip to Detroit, I wrote that city's AA central office, and they promptly sent me a meeting directory. Still unsure, I wrote again, advising them of my hotel and requesting a pinpointing of nearby meetings. I received a detailed schedule for the downtown area by return mail, and someone had drawn a map showing routes from my hotel to these meetings.

This helped, but considering how far I'd be from California, my usual meetings, and my sponsor, I decided I'd better write back and ask for some names and telephone numbers. The central office responded by requesting my flight number and time of arrival and saying someone would meet the plane!

Today, I travel all over the world on business with complete comfort, knowing there is AA everywhere. In recent months, I've been on several overseas trips and have been made welcome at meetings in great, bustling cities like Tokyo, Mexico City, London, and Athens, as well as dots on the map like Kao-hsiung (in Taiwan), Manama (the capital of the island nation of Bahrain), San Na'narit (in Thailand), Khartoum (in the Sudan), and Qurnet Chewab (in the troubled mountains north of Beirut, Lebanon).

Meetings have ranged from warm chat with a Loner on a dhow from Chittagong to full-fledged meetings of fifteen or more, complete with steering committees, newcomers, and bleeding deacons. In various locations, the last may more appropriately be known as "bleeding imams," "bleeding abbas," "bleeding canons," or "bleeding effendis," the designation being entirely dependent on the Higher Power in residence in each country.

Petitions to Allah to grant serenity and decisions to turn one's life and will over to the care of Buddha sound at first strange and somehow heretical. "Coffee breaks" for glasses of ice-cold yogurt or tiny cups full of pungent cardamom coffee, rice cakes instead of doughnuts, and being "in the chair" instead of "giving a pitch" offer striking comparisons to AA back home, but symbolically highlight the consistency and adaptability of our program.

Closing a meeting with an Arab friend, hands joined, facing Mecca, while he prays in Aramaic, the ancient language Jesus spoke, emphasizes the common bond each has with his own Higher Power. This is, after all, the fellowship of one drunk sharing with
